His global accolades and his national accomplishments helped make him a 'Giant of a Man' and for years he led the Development Office of Queen's College from a position of force and pride. He always wanted the best for the school. He displayed an eagerness for futuristic thought and progressive development. As old as he was, his energy outlasted most members of The Foundation Committee and his persuasion and persistence overwhelmed as well as encouraged.

Sir Durward's commitment to Queen's College was based on what the school had done for him. Although the times he served as Foundation Chair were vastly different to the days he sat in the classroom as a student, he

credited much of his success to the foundation he received in his early years at Q.C.
